This Pathfinder will guide you through the **Indexes** to the **Registration Number** and then to the **Registration**. To find the matching microfilm reel numbers for the Indexes and the Registrations, consult the appendix listings in the **Deaths Binder** for **Inventory 80** (**Records of the Office of the Registrar General**) or follow the links below. The microfilm is available in the Archives Reading Room through interlibrary loan.


