1. Introduction

The Boxfish Group is pleased to offer its uniquely suited expertise to the Rail Implementation Office of the City of Ottawa. The following proposal sets out the proposed services Boxfish can provide to assist with the implementation of this important project. This proposal describes the services that would be rendered starting July 4, 2011 until December 31, 2011 which would be renewable as suitable.

2. Scope of Work

Boxfish would assist RIO with the full range of strategic, legislative and communications activities. Specifically the team would attend meetings, review and advise on:

3. Level of Effort and Budget

Forecast July 4, 2011 to December 31, 2011:

120 days at a diem rate of \$1,225 (7 hours/day) plus applicable taxes.

Out of pocket expenses will be billed at cost.

Either party may terminate this agreement for whatever reason with a minimum of 30 days written notice. Monthly billing would be capped at \$25,000 per month regardless of excess hours in a given month.
