#### 1. Introduction

The Boxfish Group is pleased to continue to offer its uniquely suited expertise to the Rail Implementation Office of the City of Ottawa. The following proposal sets out proposed services that Boxfish would continue to provide to assist with the implementation of the LRT project. The period for provision of services would be June 30, 2013 until June 30, 2014.

## 3. Level of Effort and Budget

Period of Contract: from July 1, 2013 to 30 June, 2014 (up to 120 days)

Price: \$166.25 per hour (up to 120 days based on 7 hours per day)

120 days at a diem rate of \$1,163.75 (7 hours/day) plus applicable taxes.



Out of pocket expenses will be billed at cost.

Either party may terminate this agreement for whatever reason with a minimum of 30 days written notice. Work related to the TMP and WLRT is expected to be completed by October 31, 2013.
