


PUNKINHEAD'S NORTH POLE RACE

It's fun to guess who's next. Well...




Cinderella is next! Riding in a coach as grand as any in a dream!

... is for Easter. A childhood day that seems far away. But Peter Cottontail reminds us of Spring.






The Fairy Queen floats by in Springtime beauty. Seated on a water lily drawn by a swan. Oh, wondrous Storyland...

Adventure! How about the story of Jack and the Beanstalk? And Jack's battle with the giant of the castle in the sky?



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


King Cole seldom misses the Santa Claus Parade. He always brings his fiddlers three to keep him jolly company.






...is for the Laughter that lingers in the town as people once again recall the antics of a clown!





...is for the Mounties! Twelve of them! In broad brimmed hats and scarlet tunics. This is their Musical Ride!






Neptune, King of the Sea, comes in sight! As proud a monarch as any enthroned in the great hall of an earthly palace!





... is for the Old Woman who Lives in a Shoe. Like many a mother, she's brought her children to watch the celebration.






No Santa Claus Parade is complete without this children's favourite...

Punkinhead! Today he pilots a riverboat!




Following Punkinhead is a fleet of wooden shoes. Gay ships with bright pennants afluttering in the breeze!





... is for the Queen of Hearts. She has slipped from out the pages of a picture book to take part in the Parade.






... is for Rhymes. Those rollicking rhymes of Mother Goose that everybody has learned and nobody's forgotten.






Santa's Workshop! Its walls of snow are set aglow by the beam of the Northern Lights...



... from his elves within, a merry din rings round the frozen heights! Santa's Workshop!




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Here comes the Toyland Train! Packed with gifts by the elves, it has puff-puff-puffed all the way from their homeland!

What happy sightseers are these!






...is for the Upside Down Clown! Another of the many funny fellows winding in and out of the Santa Claus Parade!
