Indexes to company charters

These indexes document charters of incorporations issued to Ontario corporations. From 1868 to 1971, incorporation of businesses in Ontario was usually done through a company charter (also known as letter patents). The charter included the name of the corporation, the names of the main officers of the new corporation, and information about the share structure and initial value and the purpose of the corporation. A copy of the charter was kept in charter books.

The indexes and the charter books for the years 1868 to 1971 are held by the Archives of Ontario. Three indexes are available on microfilm, for the years 1868 to 1946. The indexes provide the liber (volume) and folio (page) number for the copy of the company charter found in the charter books. The index you will need to consult will depend on when the corporation was created and when it ceased to exist.

The charter books are available only in the Archives' Reading Room. We can also provide you with a copy of the charter if you give us the name of the corporation, the year of the charter, and the folio and liber number found in the indexes. The Archives of Ontario also hold other records pertaining to corporations as well as partnership, sole proprietorship and business name registrations. These societies included the Ancient Order of Foresters, the Canadian Order of Foresters, the Chosen Friends of the Grand Council of Ontario, the Loyal True Blue Associations, the Knights of Pythias, the Oddfellows Independent Order Lodge and many others.
